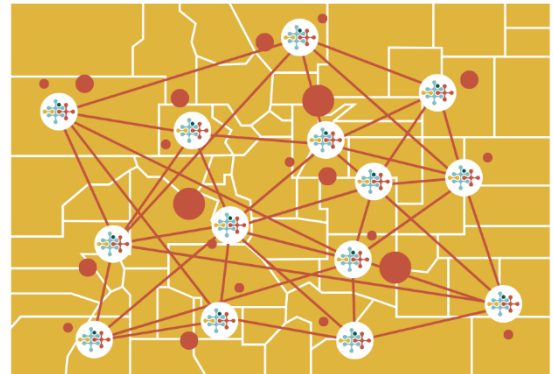


## BUILDING CIVIC STRENGTH

### SUPPORT SERVICES

<b>Community Learning Online</b>	Access to Canopy Learning Online Courses to build collaboration skills at your own pace
<b>Coaching</b>	Ongoing personalized coaching sessions focused on specific organizational challenges and development goals for individuals or teams
<b>Facilitation Training</b>	A two-day training designed to enhance facilitation skills for effective collaboration and decision making
<b>Network Convenings</b>	Participation in network-wide learning experiences designed to improve practice, share learning across the Canopy network, and spark innovative solutions
<b>Leadership Development</b>	Participation in a statewide cohort of leaders to develop the unique skills involved in providing collaborative leadership
<b>Collaborative Visioning</b>	Facilitating a “launch sequence” for your collaboration
